



MA. SUSANA P. PADILLA-CAMPOS, MD, FPSEDM, FPPS

PHILIPPINES

Dr. Susana Padilla-Campos finished her internship in Pediatrics at the St. Paul-Ramsey Hospital; her residency in Pediatrics and her Fellowship in Pediatric Endocrinology at the Children's Hospital of Buffalo-SUNY. She is a Diplomate of the American Academy of Pediatrics and its Sub-board for Pediatric Endocrinology.

She is a Professor of Pediatrics in Emilio Aguinaldo School of Medicine. She is also the Medical Director of the Medical Center Manila; and the Head of the Section of Pediatric Endocrinology of St. Luke's Medical Center-BGC, and until recently, the head of the same section of Makati Medical Center. Currently, she is a Council member and the Philippine representative to the Asian Pacific Pediatric Endocrine Society.

She served as the Editor-in-Chief of the Philippine Journal of Pediatrics and Past President of the Philippine Society of Pediatric Metabolism and Endocrinology.





SUBHANKAR CHOWDHURY, DTM&H, MD, DM (ENDO), MRCP (UK)

INDIA

Dr. Subhankar Chowdhury is Professor and Head of the Dept. of Endocrinology of IPGME&R and SSKM Hospital in Kolkata. He is also available for consultation at several hospitals and clinics around Kolkata.

Dr. Chowdhury had a brilliant academic record starting from the school-leaving examination (2nd position out of nearly 200,000 candidates), through MBBS, DTM&H, MD and DM courses (numerous college medals, scholarships and prizes, and topper in the University final examinations).

Dr. Chowdhury plays an active role in several medical associations. He is Secretary of the West Bengal Chapter of the Research Society for the Study of Diabetes in India (RSSDI), and Immediate Past President of the Endocrine Society of India. He is also a Founder Patron of the South Asian Federation of Endocrine Societies. He is President of the Endocrine Society of Bengal.

He was a clinical research fellow in St. Vincent in United Kingdom from 1996-97.


BART L. CLARKE, MD, FACP, FAACE

Dr. Bart L. Clarke is a Professor of Medicine in Mayo Clinic College of Medicine and a consultant at the Department of Medicine, Division of Endocrinology, Diabetes, Metabolism and Nutrition in Mayo Clinic. He completed his Fellowship in Bone and Mineral Metabolism, and Endocrinology and Metabolism in Mayo Clinic Rochester.

He is the President-elect of the American Society for Bone and Mineral Research; Co-Chair for North America Global Scientific Steering Committee of the PARADIGHM Hypoparathyroidism Registry; member of the International Osteoporosis Foundation Committee of Scientific Advisors and of the NASA Bone Research and Clinical Advisory Panel. He is also the American Society for Bone and Mineral Research Representative to US Bone and Joint Initiative Board and the Co-Chair of the American Society for Bone and Mineral Research Development.

Dr. Clarke sits on the Editorial Board of the Mayo Clinic Health Letter, the International Journal of Osteoporosis and Metabolic Disorders, the Bone Reports, the Journal of Endocrine Disorders and the Metabolism Clinical and Experimental. He is also the Editor of Bone and Calcium Metabolism, the yearbook in Endocrinology. He is a scientific article reviewer for medical journals, such as the Journal of the American Medical Association, American Journal of Physiology, Mayo Clinic Proceedings, Journal of Bone and Mineral Research, to name a few.

His clinical practice focuses on metabolic bone disease, with special interest on steroid-induced osteoporosis and transplantation osteoporosis. His researches delve on regulation of phosphate metabolism by phosphatonins; steroid-induced osteoporosis; transplantation osteoporosis; postmenopausal osteoporosis; treatment of hypercalcemia; hypoparathyroidism and primary hyperparathyroidism; bone histomorphometry and mechanisms of osteoporosis in men; biochemical markers of bone turnover in metabolic bone disease; molecular mechanisms of diseases of bone and mineral metabolism; role of second messengers including calcium and protein kinase C in intracellular signaling in bovine and human parathyroid cells. He published numerous bone and endocrine-related materials in CD-ROMs, audio tapes, video tapes, web articles, abstracts, and journal articles.





FROILAN DE LEON, MD, FPCP, FPSN

PHILIPPINES

Dr. Froilan de Leon finished his post graduate internship and Residency in Internal Medicine at the University of Santo Tomas Hospital. He obtained his Fellowship in Nephrology in the same institution.

He is an Associate Professor at the UST Faculty of Medicine and Surgery and the Medical Director of Nephrocare Philippines.

Previously, he was the Chief of the Section of Nephrology in USTH and UST Faculty of Medicine and Surgery from 2000-2010. He also served as the Chairman of the Task Force on Deceased Organ Donation of the Philippine Society of Nephrology. He was a Board Member of the Philippine Specialty Board of Nephrology and the Philippine Society of Nephrology; and Past President of the Philippine Association for Renal Health. He also became the Chief of the Section of Nephrology of San Juan de Dios Hospital.

He was awarded the Special Award for Community Service in 2008; and the Special Award for Medical Education in 2012 given by the Philippine Society of Nephrology. He was also the Distinguished Fellow of the Philippine College of Physicians in 2016.

Dr. de Leon is a member of the International Society of Nephrology, Philippine Society of Hypertension, Philippine Medical Association and the Philippine Association for Renal Health.

LONABEL PIA ANCHETA-ENCARNACION, MD, FPDS

Dr. Lonabel Pia Ancheta-Encarnacion is the Head of the Department of Dermatology and the Dermatology Center in St. Luke's Medical Center-QC. She is also the Chief of the Environmental Dermatology Unit of the said hospital. She also serves as an Assistant Clinical Professor II in St. Luke's College of Medicine. Concurrently, she also heads the Center for Occupational Health and Environmental Safety Services of the St. Luke's Medical Center-BGC.

She is part of the Faculty of Basic and Advanced Course in Occupational Dermatology of the Philippine College of Occupational Medicine; and a previous Course Director and Lecturer of the Associate's Dermatology Review Course of the Philippine Dermatological Society.

She trained as Research Fellow in Environmental Dermatology in the Department of Dermatology in St. Luke's - Roosevelt Hospital, Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York.

She received the L'Oreal & Galderma International Awards for Social Responsibility in Dermatology Laureate for the Asia Pacific Region in 2011.

She has delivered and presented scientific papers and lectures in various national and international dermatologic conferences.

Dr. Joy is a past president of the AACE-Philippines. She is the creator and Editor-in-Chief of DiabetEASE magazine, the country's first widely circulated commercial newsstand magazine on living well with diabetes.

She finished her fellowship training in Endocrinology, Diabetes, and Metabolism at the University of Illinois at Chicago and residency in Internal Medicine at the Cleveland Clinic in Ohio. She graduated from the University of the Philippines College of Medicine's elite INTARMED program.

Dr. Fontanilla ranked in the top ten percent of the Diplomate Exams of both the American Board of Internal Medicine, as well as the American Board of Endocrinology, Diabetes and Metabolism.

She was the founding Chair of the Department of Pharmacology, San Beda College of Medicine. She was also a member of the Board of Directors of the Diabetes Philippines and a member of the Unite for Diabetes consensus panel which helped formulate the Philippine Clinical Practice Guidelines in the Diagnosis and Management of Diabetes.

She currently heads the Center for Weight Intervention and Nutrition Services at the St. Luke's Medical Center – Global City, as well as the Nutrition Committee of the Asian Hospital and Medical Center. She is also the Chair of the National Assembly of Diabetes Educators, Philippine Center for Diabetes Education Foundation.

She is a Fellow of the American College of Endocrinology, Philippine College of Physicians, Philippine College of Diabetes Educators, and Philippine Society of Endocrinology, Diabetes, and Metabolism.

PHILIPPINES





Team PETMALU was crowned winner of the Amazing AACE contest. But since this was another wonderful and successful event for the AACE-PC, all participants went home as winners.





























Palao, its very active coordinator. As always, our energetic staff, Rex and Jing provided the technical and logistics support.

The whole day activity proved to be very exciting and challenging to the pupils and the team as well.

The participants were very attentive during the lecture and actively participated in the group discussions afterwards. They were divided into groups and were made to interpret nutrition facts in common packed snacks available in groceries. The POPTFN team who acted as facilitators also gave mini lectures on calorie and carbohydrate counting.

One of the highlights of every POPTFN activity is the Zumba. Even the teachers and parents, together with the students, joined and immensely enjoyed the exercise.

To complete the program, games and cheering competitions were also conducted. The pupils and their advisers also prepared low calorie desserts. The POPTFN team acted as judges. Prizes were awarded.

Overall, the POPTFN activity held last November 6, 2017 was a success. The team is looking forward to more activities aimed at encouraging children to adopt healthy habits, and thus prevent lifestyle diseases.







AACE-Philippine Chapter brought happiness to Aeta students from St. Francis Learning Center through the GOOD Outreach Day conducted last April 7, 2018 in Subic, Zambales. St. Francis Learning Center is different from other schools since it specifically caters to members of the indigenous Aeta community. The school was founded and operated by members of the Franciscan Sisters of the Immaculate Conception (SFIC), with SFIC Sr. Mary Francis Borje as the overall coordinator and school directress. The school's mission was to empower Aeta people so they would live as equals with the rest of the community.

The donated items were turned over to the school principal SFIC Sr. Junetta Jimenez and several Aeta students; and the activity was held at the multi-purpose hall of the school. These included a refrigerator, chest freezer, industrial rice cooker, stoves, and several kitchen wares.

Sr. Junetta, in her message of thanks mentioned that these items will be of great help in their daily operations since the school also houses two dormitories and they are also responsible for feeding more than 100 students. These will also be used in their different livelihood projects. Before we left, the Aeta students expressed their sincere appreciation by tearfully performing a song number.

The Annual GOOD outreach program of the AACE Philippine chapter is part of our corporate social responsibility of giving back to our less fortunate brothers and sisters.

AACE-PC History with Angara

When did the bond between AACE-PC and Angara

It all began when Former Senate President Edgardo J. Angara (SEJA) graced the launch of the American Association of Clinical Endocrinologists Philippine Chapter (AACE-PC) at the Ayala Museum on August 25,

Then AACE President Dr. Steven Petak and Founding President Dr. George Tan spoke about the vision and mission of AACE and AACE-PC respectively. The founding members of AACE-PC also paid tribute then to the Father of Philippine Endocrinology, Dr. Augusto D. Litonjua with the Living Legend Award.

Impressed by the advocacies of AACE-PC that aligned with his public service achievements, Senator Angara, of his own accord, gave a sizable donation to AACE-PC on November 22, 2006. This became the seed money for one of AACE-PC's flagship programs - the Power of revention through Fitness and Nutrition (POPTFN).

The POPTFN was launched on November 11, 2007 and

piloted during the 2008-2009 schoolyear in six private schools in Luzon. Grade 6 students were taught how to incorporate proper nutrition and physical activity in their daily routine.

In recognition of his landmark legislative efforts in the fields of education and health, a Medal of Excellence for Health Conscious Students or the Senator Ed Angara Active Lifestyle Award (SEAALA) was awarded by AACE-PC at the Intercontinental Hotel in Makati on April 15, 2009 to twelve children chosen for being healthy lifestyle role models in his presence.

On August 2, 2013, SEJA was invited by original POPTFN chair and then incoming AACE-PC President Dr. Florence Santos to the induction ceremonies of the AACE-PC officers and board.

Why the SEAALA?

Senator Ed Angara was the longest serving senator after the EDSA revolution restored democracy in 1986 and probably the most accomplished.

This visionary from Aurora province authored and sponsored several momentous health laws with such far-reaching impact like the Generics Drug Law, the Magna Carta for Public Health Workers, the Breast Feeding Act, the Philippine Nursing Act, the Organ Donation Act and the laws that created PHILHEALTH, the national health insurance program, as well as the National Institutes of Health (NIH) for the promotion of health research and development.

He is fondly remembered for the Senior Citizens Act, also known as The Angara Law, which benefits the country's millions of elderly citizens, who now enjoy discounts in pharmacies, restaurants, transportation, even movie theaters.

SEJA was a strong stalwart for education and social services. He believed sternly that education is the great equalizer and made it his lifelong goal of "giving every Filipino a fighting chance".

This boy from Baler has passed crucial legislation that has become the bedrock of Philippine education today.

He sponsored the Free High School Act, the Free Kindergarten Education Act, the Government Assistance to Students and Teachers in Private Education and the laws that created the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA).

He also championed multiple measures for agriculture, arts and culture, science and technology, good governance, financial reforms and social welfare. His encyclopedic achievements are just too many to

But he was never one to rest on his laurels.

Though retired from the Senate, he still happily we off to work at ACCRA Law offices almost every weekda while also serving as the government's special envoy the European Union. He had so many plans including setting up a world-class trauma hospital and promoting tourism for his beloved Baler.

Thus, unexpectedly, on May 13, 2018, the huge heart the wise educator, visionary leader, prodigion legislator, simple farmer, witty author, and dedicate family man succumbed at the age of 83.

A gaping hole in the national landscape has been made by Angara's passing. And it will be sensed long after h has been laid to rest.

Thank you and farewell, dear SEJA! May you rest in peace.


It was indeed a successful activity as everyone went home with a full knowledge about their disease and how to control it. They were not just educated but entertained as well.


